**Dr. Francis Zwiers will speak to the Causes and Effects of Climate Change in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Dr. Zwiers is Director, Pacific Climate Impacts Consortium, and a member of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. The IPCC shared the 2007 Nobel Peace Prize with Al Gore for “their efforts to build up and disseminate greater knowledge about man-made climate change, and to lay the foundations for the measures that are needed to counteract such change.”**

**Dr. Aleck Ostry will address the insecurity of our food supply and why it is of local concern. Dr. Ostry is Canada Research Chair, Social Determinants of Community Health and Associate Professor, Department of Geography, University of Victoria. He has received several awards for his work in Health Research. One focus of his research program is food security and nutrition policy in Canada.**
