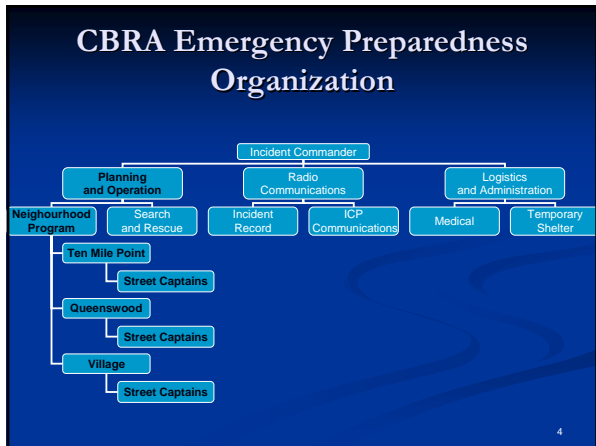

- ## Duties of a Street Captain During Non-emergency Times
- Maintain a current list of residents of the homes you are responsible for.
  - Have a backup and potential runners.
  - Have knowledge of more vulnerable residents.
  - Have knowledge of personal skills and useful equipment available.
  - Ensure neighbours know who you are and where you live

- ## Duties of a Street Captain During Non-emergency Times (cont.)
- Know the location of your local Radio Units (Operators) and your potential runners.
  - Attend Annual General Meetings.
  - Take training courses when available.

## Duties of a Street Captain in a Declared Emergency

- Look after your own family concerns.
- Patrol and assess aid and assistance requirements for homes you are responsible for.

## Duties of a Street Captain in a Declared Emergency (cont.)

- You are independent and self-reliant
- Inform the Incident Command Post (by radio or runner) of any additional assistance required.
- Monitor the situation and pass on any pertinent information to the ICP.
- Pass on information received from the ICP to residents.

## Radio Network Configuration

- Network composed of VHF (Ham) radios and UHF (Family Service Radios)
- Network designed to provide street captains a link for assistance via radio operators
- The three zones operate on UHF radios back to the ICP for local communications
- Outside communications via VHF radios
- Flags and flashing lights are used to identify radio locations

## Equipment

UHF – 1 watt, 2 km range, AA batteries, small, rugged, no license required.



VHF - 25 watt, + 60 km range, 12 volt or AC, mobile but cumbersome, amateur radio licence required.

## How does it work?

- A street captain requiring assistance for a neighbour sends a request via runner to the nearest radio operator
- The message is relayed to the Incident Command Post who responds as required
- The ICP radios a request for a response to the street captain via the radio operator/runner
- Network is also used to gather damage reports so the ICP can develop situation assessment to relay to Municipal center
