The Cadboro Bay Residents Association would like to take this opportunity to advise you of recent discussions regarding the construction of a secondary sewage treatment facility in the Saanich East/NorthOak Bay area. We would like you to know we support the proposal to locate an 'energy/research' centre on campus. This would be a proactive move to address the tremendous burden of supporting a campus population of 26,000 + on the current infrastructure.

The Cadboro Bay Residents Association would applaud any consideration of an option that increases the resource recovery that a plant such as the one envisioned would offer. The University's own Sustainability Action Plan confirms such a commitment. Here is an opportunity for the University to not only act as a good neighbor by bearing the responsibility for treating the effluent associated with the campus, but to act as a leader in the environment as well. Cadboro Bay residents have overwhelmingly called for preservation of Haro Woods and prevention of siting a Sewage Treatment Plant in this location; a petition of over 900 signatures attests to that response, even though the petition specifically addressed only the Saanich portion.
